WABA NUN-NUNG GOSPEL CHAPEL

God has brought blessings and changes in the last three months. Beginning in March we started a series on the passion of Christ from the book of Mark. We learned, grew, and were moved to wonder love and praise as we studied the Scripture and progressed toward the crucifixion. For our Good



Friday service, we shared a Passover meal like the one Jesus shared with the disciples, and learned about the institution of the Lord's Supper, and how Passover is a type of the sacrifice of Christ. By God's grace more people attended this Passover supper than the last one we gave, including several native people from the community who had not attended previously. The culmination was of course on resurrection Sunday, God's vindication of everything Christ had accomplished on the cross, His exclamation mark on redemption. We stayed in the gospels for two additional weeks studying the appearance of Christ to the disciples on the road to Emmaus, and then His appearance on the shore of the Sea of Tiberias, where He forgave, restored and commissioned Peter. Our time in the gospels was challenging and enriching, but now we are returning to our study of Moses and the children of Israel in Exodus.

God has also opened up a new ministry for us on Sunday afternoon. A man in our church expressed an interest in meeting weekly to study the promises of God. The study and fellowship has been a blessing, and God has since added to our number. It is a great encouragement to meet with other men, study the Scripture, to grow, challenge and exhort one another.

Well the summer has begun the mosquitos are out and kids are in and out on a weekly basis.

We just finished up a small camp with about 10 local kids and 12 from a church in Illinois. We would normally have taken a wilderness camping trip but weather and rain and high water wouldn't allow. So we stayed at our facility and took a couple trips swimming and canoeing. The week went well, some good connections were made and the Gospel was able to be heard.

This upcoming week we have a Vacation Bible School at one of our churches. A great partner in our ministry from Village Church of Bartlett III. will be working alongside of us this week. We'll also be able to get few projects done around the mission as well during the week.

Summer around here is full of work groups, repair projects, laughing children, and mosquitos. Throw in some baseball, water balloons, grass mowing, and ice cream and the day's fly by. May and June so far have been eventful and July promises to be hectic so things here are great! It's always a joy to watch the faith in action that summer so often produces.

Our youngest son, Jonah, started working his first real job this summer in a local sporting goods store. He eats, sleeps, and breathes hunting and fishing so he is in his glory stocking fishing supplies and cleaning bait tanks. He had a successful turkey season this year taking a nice tom. He is also taking Drivers Ed this summer and is excited. He is into his second season of spring baseball and switches between pitching and third base. I think baseball is his favorite sport but I wonder if he says that about whatever sport he happens to be playing at the time. He is also looking forward to playing on our church league softball team this year. He goes into 10th grade this fall. He keeps us running but he has a great attitude and works hard at whatever he does.

Chase finished college this May with a 4.0 GPA, graduating at the top of his class. We are very proud of all his hard work! He is in his element working with metal and recently left his job of 3 years at a fabricating shop to take a position running CNC machines for an area machine shop. He is excited to be done with school and able to focus strictly on work. He spends his weekends fishing, playing horseshoes, or going to the movies with his girlfriend Brooke. Brooke graduated valedictorian of her class this spring and is excited to go to college this fall, pursuing a career in nursing.

Michelle and I were in a motorcycle accident on Mother's Day. A car pulled out into traffic and hit us on the left side. Her left leg was broken mid-way between the knee and ankle. She had 3 surgeries and was in the hospital a week. She will be off work for a while yet, doing physical therapy while the torn muscles and bones heal. We are so thankful that the accident wasn't any worse. Michelle and I have had so much peace, knowing God is in control. Before we left the accident scene in the ambulance Michelle wouldn't let them move her from the road until she could tell everyone standing around this: "Does everyone here know Jesus? Jesus is bigger than any problem here on earth. He has got this. If you don't know Him yet, you should." We are both thankful for the chance to grow in faith and lean on HIS peace, no matter what goes on around us.

Things here at the shelter are slow at the moment. We have 1 single man in emergency shelter, and 1 single man in transitional housing. God's timing is always perfect, when things get busier in one area they usually slow down in another area. Our case manager came back from her mission trip and took a full time position elsewhere so we are again looking for someone to help out doing case management here at the shelter. Kathy's mother just passed away earlier this week so please keep her in your prayers. She and Russ continue to do an incredible job handing most of the everyday needs of the residents. It is such a blessing to have brothers and sisters in Christ that work very well together to split the workload so no one of us is overwhelmed. We continue to do a lot of transportation for our residents. Right now we have empty beds but I don't expect them to stay that way for long, we get calls almost every day. Overall things are going smoothly here at the shelter; our program participation numbers are consistent through these last 7 years. We encourage our residents to join us in church, Bible studies, and fellowship groups but they are not required to attend. Some of our residents are interested in the discussions and message while too many are not. All we can do is provide the opportunity.

In the last 7 years we have served more than 227 residents providing almost 11,000 shelter nights. Annually we receive approximately 120 calls from people looking for shelter. We continue to average about 5 residents per night. We continue to help people transitioning from jail, rehab, and probation/parole providing a stable supervised place from which they could find employment and seek housing. Please keep in prayer our staff as we struggle to reach out to our residents.

We are praying for opportunities to minister to not only their physical needs but also their spiritual needs. Please continue to pray for our residents as they struggle to grasp hold of stability and sobriety.

Thank you for your continued prayers. It is through your persevering faith in God's ministry here that we are able to keep doing His work in our community. We are so thankful for your donations of time spent in prayer on our behalf, the gifts of day-to-day supplies, and your generosity of financial support that keeps us moving forward in HIS perfect plan.
