Dear Friends,

We are ever grateful for what God has been doing in the last months. In June we took time out from our study in I Corinthians to do a topical series on why God permits His

children to suffer. We minister in a community where every family is continually touched by suffering or grieving a loss. The community is still grieving one loss and another death occurs. The series lasted four weeks and took us into July. I am grateful that God used these Scriptural truths to touch and bring healing in the lives of some in the congregation. We have now resumed our study in I Corinthians and the chapters we are currently studying give teaching on marriage and singleness, the right use of Christian freedom, the Lord's Supper, and spiritual gifts. In junior church Cheryl was teaching the children from Proverbs in June. She finished that study and is now teaching the children about prayer. She is having them memorize Scripture, and we are excited to see how God will use the truth that has been hidden in the hearts of these children.

God has also been working in the food pantry ministry. We served eleven families in June. In July we were not certain if we could open our church pantry. There was a bad storm the night before and a state of emergency was declared in Wisconsin. We had no power or phone in Crandon, and we had no way to know if there was power in Mole Lake. We went to open by faith. The power was on in Mole Lake, and we had nine families come for help. God was gracious and opened the door for us to serve and share the love of Christ with others. Our church pantry in August served eleven families, and so did the one in September although they are not the same eleven families each month. Some different families come every month.

This summer came and went in a flash! We were kept busy with day to day life, and everything else that is often thrown at us. Our summer was quite a wet one, with a few weeks of warmth thrown in there for good measure. Now it's turned into cooler weather and the leaves are starting to change, which is always so beautiful to see. I love this time of year! It always makes me want to curl up with a nice hot cup of tea and a cozy quilt.

We had Vacation Bible School this year, in early July. The group was from Mt. Hope Church in the Detroit area and they brought many youths with them. We had several children from the Carter/Wabeno area and I think they enjoyed themselves for the 3 nights of VBS.

As we have mentioned before, during a funeral last winter, it was noticed by various elders of the tribe, that our church at Carter is not in compliance with the American Disability Act (ADA) due to the basement having no handicap access to it, which is where the kitchen and bathrooms are. While our current church serves us well, it's an older building that is used for various funerals and community events. One thing led to another and the tribe has graciously offered to build us a new church at Carter. We were able to create the layout of the building ourselves and the final plan will give us about 5,784 sqft with a fellowship hall, kitchen, bathrooms, nursery, and a large open sanctuary. I believe the ground breaking will happen once their new fiscal year begins, which is October 1. We are very hopeful to be in the new building by Christmas!

This season is traditionally a difficult one for many people in our community. From the lack of sunlight to the anniversary of a loved one's death. Please continue to pray with us that the Lord Jesus shines through us as we interact with those who need His light in our community. It can be easy to go about our own lives and forget that so many people around us are hurting and suffering, whether they live in our community or yours. As Christians, we are ambassadors of Christ. This is an important fact that each and every one of us need to keep foremost in our minds. Those who don't know Christ watch those of us who do, and they need to see that there is a difference in our lives, that He, and only He, can fill that void that is within them.

NEW HOPE SHELTER & TRANSITIONAL HOUSING

I am sure of this, that he who started a good work in you will carry it on to completion until the day of Christ Jesus. **Philippians 1:6**

Today, the reassurance of this verse is the lighthouse in the storm of my week. Some days I feel adrift and coasting, waiting, with no sense of bearing or direction. Other days I feel stretched and blown by the winds of the

Spirit, leading and pointing in such a specific direction that it casts those feelings of being adrift into distant memory. Lately though, I find myself in the midst of the chaos of the storm, fighting to hold a bearing, fearing the rocks and praying for the light of guidance. My comfort comes from the knowledge of peace and growth no matter the circumstance of sailing conditions. I'm not sure why I'm thinking in terms of naval reference but I am left wondering if there is a Jonah I should be casting overboard (my youngest son is an excellent swimmer and I would assume God has a great fish prepared).

Summer here was wet, buggy, and too short. We did get to do some traveling, spent some time with family, and visited around the campfire this summer which was a blessing. We are hoping to get in some additional fall camping amid the firewood making, garden prepping, and general winterizing that punctuates the end of summer.

Michelle is enjoying working outside in the yard, tending her chickens, and harvesting the herbs and vegetables from her raised-bed gardens she built this spring. Our youngest son, Jonah (17), is working a part-time job as he begins his senior year of high school. He suffered an ankle injury and will miss the remainder of football season but is looking forward to wrestling later this fall. I think he is participating in every hunting season available to him this year, and loving every minute of it. Our oldest son Chase (21) is busy with work. He recently purchased his first home, closing on it Oct. 1st. He's excited to be moving out of his small apartment and has many improvement projects ahead of him. He is also busy planning his fall 2020 wedding with his fiancé Brooke. Next year is shaping up to be eventful with Jonah graduating high school, Chase and Brooke getting married, and Jonah continuing his education that fall. Please keep the changing dynamic of our family in prayer!

While we continue to raise funds for our Emergency Shelter program we are still sorting out the details of our Transitional Housing remodeling project. We know that it will be a long term project and that in the end it will likely be different than we expect right now. As always we are praying that God guides and directs this project and we trust His hand in all things. Please be in prayer with us that we continue to walk in His will and obedience to His plan.

We are just beginning our 10th year of Emergency Shelter operations! Things here at the shelter are going well. We have folks checking in and out just about every week and as of this afternoon we currently have 2 single men, 2 single women, and one family of 2 in emergency shelter. We are serving a total of 5 households, occupying 3 of our 4 apartments. The 4th apartment is occupied by our intern Russ. We have a couple of recently emptied beds but we have had several calls from folks so I expect them to fill up soon. Overall things at the shelter are going as smoothly as we could expect. We encourage our residents to join us in church, Bible studies, and fellowship groups but they are not required to attend. Some of our residents are interested in the discussions and message while too many are not; all we can do is provide the opportunity. We pray that He will prepare the hearts of our residents to be open to the Word of God.

Kathy, Eugene, and Russ continue to do an incredible job handling most of the everyday needs of the residents. It is such a blessing to have brothers and sisters in Christ that work very well together to split the workload so no one of us is overwhelmed. We continue to do a lot of transportation for our residents.

Thank you for your continued prayers. It is through your persevering faith in God's ministry here that we are able to keep doing His work in our community. We are so thankful for your donations of time spent in prayer on our behalf, the gifts of day-to-day supplies, and your generosity of financial support that keeps us moving forward in HIS perfect plan.
