Dear Friends,

The last three months have been times of change and adaptation for all of us. During March and the first part of April we studied the passion and resurrection of Christ from



the Apostle John's perspective. When the pandemic hit in late March, we could no longer meet for Sunday services. At that time, we adapted as all churches have and started ministering using the internet. We stayed in touch with the church and community members through the phone and internet. We called each week to check on them and take any prayer requests. The weekly sermons are recorded as videos and posted on the church face book page.

We finished our study in John on Easter Sunday and resumed our study in I Corinthians. In the last weeks we have finished Paul's instruction on love and the spiritual gifts. We will begin to dig into the beautiful chapter Paul has written on the resurrection, chapter 15.

In junior church Cheryl was teaching the children about Christ being our sin bearer and bringing the message home through biblical teaching, memory verses and object lessons. That teaching ceased when the pandemic forced us to stop meeting for Sunday services. Cheryl still stays in touch as best she can with the children. We are now open for worship as of Sunday May 17th. The pandemic has not closed the pantries in the state so both our mission and church pantries remain open.



NEW HOPE SHELTER & TRANSITIONAL HOUSING

If I speak in the tongues of men or of angels, but do not have love, I am only a resounding gong or a clanging cymbal. If I have the gift of prophecy and can fathom all mysteries and all knowledge, and if I have a faith that can move mountains, but do not have love, I am nothing. If I give all I possess to the poor and give over my body to hardship that I may boast, but do not have love, I gain nothing. I Cor. 13:1-3 It's easier to love someone we agree with. It's easier to show love to someone

we like or understand. It's easier to show love to someone we have a connection to, like an old family friend, coworker, relative, or community member. It's easier to show love to people we disagree with if there is a relationship. We make allowances for differences of opinion when it's someone we love. When I hear the phrase "love is blind" I think of teenage infatuation, ignoring glaring flaws of incompatibility, but maybe we need to love a little more blindly. Love first, without qualification, without someone deserving it first, without someone having to earn it. Love does not mean "I agree with and condone every action and word". God's love is unconditional, he loves the person, not necessarily the action. In Matthew 5 Jesus tells us to "*love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you*,". He didn't just say it without living it either. Jesus even asked the Father for forgiveness for the people that were crucifying Him. They didn't agree with or love Him, they were killing him, and yet He loved them enough to ask for the Father to forgive them, despite their lack of remorse or repentance. We're not perfect and love is hard work, both mentally and physically. I won't always succeed in living out Christs love but He said without it my faith is nothing, so I try. It's not one of my strengths so I have to try harder. Love first. Love blindly. Love is action.

Love is patient, love is kind. It does not envy, it does not boast, it is not proud. It does not dishonor others, it is not self-seeking, it is not easily angered, it keeps no record of wrongs. Love does not delight in evil but rejoices with the truth. It always protects, always trusts, always hopes, always perseveres. **1 Cor. 13:4-7**

This summer is starting off a little different than most but we'll see where God leads. I dislike change but every year I get a little better at adapting. It seems like this year will be an opportunity to practice that flexibility.

Michelle is still working full-time despite many lay-offs at her work. She is in a tough position, trying to keep up with the increased workload and she's concerned for her co-workers who are laid off. We are trusting God's plan. Her chickens are laying more eggs, keeping the yard more-or-less bug free, at the expense of paths and patios being covered in chicken droppings.

Our youngest son, Jonah (17), graduated high school this year. His graduation ceremony and celebration got moved into mid-July. He is working for a local landscaping company, rising with the birds to do physical labor all day. We are very proud of the hardworking man he is becoming. He was disappointed to miss out on all his spring sports and end of year school activities but he is adapting.

Our oldest son Chase (21) is busy with work. Last fall he purchased his first home and has been busy remodeling and landscaping. He is also busy planning his October wedding with his fiancé Brooke. We are excited!

Things at the shelter have been surprisingly normal. We didn't get a rush of applicants like we were worried we might. We extended our current residents to stay as long as they needed but everyone found a place to move in to relatively quickly. There are obviously still several barriers to housing and employment but thankfully our residents and staff have been able to stay safe and healthy here with us. Funding is always a concern as many of our grants come from private corporations which are struggling but we trust God's plan! As always we are praying that God guides and directs this project and we trust His hand in all things. Please be in prayer with us that we continue to walk in His will and obedience to His plan. As of this afternoon we currently have 2 single men, and 3 single ladies in emergency shelter. Overall things at the shelter are going as smoothly as we could expect. We encourage our residents to join us in church, Bible studies, and fellowship groups but they are not required to attend. We pray that He will prepare the hearts of our residents to be open to the Word of God.

Kathy, Eugene, and Russ continue to do an incredible job handling most of the everyday needs of the residents. It is such a blessing to have brothers and sisters in Christ that work very well together to split the workload so no one of us is overwhelmed.
