Dear Friends,

We wish all of you a Merry Christmas. The last three months have taught us to rely all the more on God's strength. In October we completed the study of the lives of the



apostles. The month of November was dedicated to studying Luke's abbreviated version of the Sermon on the Mount. We are currently in Luke seven studying the faith of the Roman Centurion.

In Junior church Cheryl has been teaching a variety of Biblical topics. In October she taught a variety of lessons from the Scripture on overcoming fear, as well as lessons on overcoming the monsters which threaten our walk with God; fear, anger, selfishness, apathy and loneliness. The November lessons focused on thankfulness. This month she will focus on the Christmas message of the Gospel. In the past few months' children have come only occasionally. She has also been meeting regularly with women in the community for lunch, special craft days, and to go to the Potawatomi recreation center; building relationships and sharing the gospel. Our visitation ministry in the community was steady through October. It became intensely focused in November. After having trouble finding people at home for three weeks, we found ourselves able to visit ten families in one week when we delivered turkeys to them for Thanksgiving.

Both the mission and church pantries have provided ample opportunities in the past few months. We've had as many as ten families in the mission pantry each week. In our church pantry we helped two families in October and five when pantry was open in November. In November we also helped two other families later in the month. We would pray for each family, and on two occasions we had individuals willing to listen to and consider the gospel. Our church pantry this month will be on the eleventh.
