Dear Friends,

The last three months have been busy and we are grateful for the work God has been doing. On Sunday mornings we studied in Luke until the first of this month. In March we began a study in Isaiah 53 with an



introduction in Isaiah 52:13-15. In Junior Church Cheryl was teaching the children about the I AM statements of Christ in January, the love of God in February, and now John 3 in March. The church pantry has been steady serving 6 to 10 families every month. The mission pantry has been very busy with up to 13 families each week. The conversations in pantry have given many opportunities for prayer and witness.

We inaugurated two new ministries in January. Our men's fellowship began meeting twice a month. We have 6 to 7 men that come every other week for Bible study, fellowship, and a meal on Saturday mornings. We are using videos from the "Authentic Manhood" series and the men are finding it quite helpful. Cheryl also began her "Ladies Gathering" meeting twice a month in January every other Thursday. They have been studying the gospel of John together, sharing a meal and crafts. Three to five women attend these meetings consistently. We are so grateful for your prayers and support.




#### JENSEN NEWS



There have been so many things that have taken place since our last newsletter, but I will try to get you up to speed and hopefully not miss too much. We have been very busy and sometimes we feel like we are only home to eat, sleep, do a load of laundry, and then rush out the door. I've been told that someday we will wish for the busyness again so we will soak it up as much as we can.

Hope (22), as you know, is a CRU intern working with college students at the University of Green Bay and St. Norbert College. We're excited that she has been asked to lead a group of 12 students to El Salvador in just a few short days for a week. She has been working hard to have all the plans, projects, lessons, and details together. She will have another leader there with her, but they will be helping to assist Hope and her needs during the trip. While they're there, they will be providing clean water to families with filters and explaining the gospel using the filter as an object lesson. We can't wait to see what more the Lord has in store for her and her ministry.

Mason (16) has been continuing to put in work on and off the wrestling mat. In school he was inducted into Spanish Honor Society, received an award for Academic All-Conference, and High Honors. Girl's wrestling has exploded over the past couple years and there are other girls that wrestle in the area to make this something she can do. We did run into a little bump in her 3rd tournament of the season, and she tore her medial meniscus. She had surgery 2 weeks ago and is healing up nicely. She should be back to regular movement and ready for the volleyball court in just a couple months. Jess was also just hired for her first job at a local Ice Cream Shop. We're excited for her to have this opportunity.

Benjamin has been working around the mission, planning summer outreach, plowing snow, coaching Middle School wrestling, and helping with the High School wrestling program, attending a pastor's fellowship as well as a men's fellowship. He has been helping out as a substitute teacher at the Public School, working with kids Kindergarten to Senior. It's so funny to hear the stories he comes home to tell us. This has been such a blessing to be able to connect with all the kids in the district in a different way. He gets to see all the familiar faces and work with the kids we have grown to know through ministry. As for me, I have been rehearsing music for church, started attending a discipleship group, and I'm still driving bus for the Sokaogon Chippewa kids, not to mention all the label reading and research on being Gluten free. 
We thank you all for your support in the ministry through prayer and financial and physical help during the year!! We couldn't do it without the help of so many wonderful people!!

As you come to him, a living stone—rejected by people but chosen and honored by God—you yourselves, as living stones, a spiritual house, are being built to be a holy priesthood to offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ. 1 Peter 2:4-5 csb

This verse has been on my heart recently. We believers, rejected by the world as fools, yet honored by God to be adopted and called sons and daughters, are called to be fitted and laid together, being supported

by and supporting each other, unified as a spiritual house, to serve Him. What a powerful picture that paints. We are called to unity, despite the different shapes of our stones. We are honored and adopted despite our differences in history, understanding or ability. We are called living stones as we are to be active and filled with purpose, offering spiritual sacrifices of our lives. Praise God for His grace, provision for our future, and for hope!

School has been good for me despite the strain on my schedule. The work is challenging, and I am pushed into situations that help me rely on Christ's strength and provision rather than my own. I have completed 2 classes and have 10 more to go before I finish this Master of Arts Degree in Ministry Studies, graduating in the fall of 2024. As of last fall I have been alternating monthly with another local pastor to do jail ministry and that has been both challenging and rewarding. I have my hands full, and God is blessing me with the focus, strength, and energy to accomplish whatever He puts in front of me to do.

Michelle has been busy spoiling our granddaughter Erin, born January 27<sup>th</sup>. We have been blessed to spend a lot of time with Chase and Brooke and baby, especially on Sunday afternoons after church when we eat lunch together at our house and unwind after the long week. Her work has been particularly busy these last few months and she is ready for spring with the gardens and blooms that accompany it.

Our youngest son, Jonah (20), continues in his work as a welder in a local trolley manufacturing facility. We are thankful he has full-time employment and works so close to home that we are able to spend time with him regularly. Mid-winter he moved into a house and is splitting rent with a hunting buddy. He is enjoying living on his own and experiencing all the new things that that provides. He comes over for supper every Tuesday night and we catch up and talk about summer plans and recent hunting and fishing adventures.

Our oldest son Chase (24) and his wife Brooke welcomed Erin Rae Michelle Dewing into the world at the end of January! They are excited and absolutely loving being new parents. Baby is healthy and happy and growing fast. Thankfully Brooke's work has generously allowed her much time off to stay home with baby full-time for 3 months before she goes back to work part-time and hopefully remotely.

Things at the shelter have been busy this winter. We currently have 4-5 single adults in Emergency Shelter. The names seem to change every few weeks with some folks leaving and new folks checking in while the numbers remain consistent. We currently have 1 single adult in our Transitional Housing program. Locally, employment has remained plentiful although housing remains scarce. Thankfully our residents and staff have been able to stay safe and healthy here with us. Funding is always a concern, and we appreciate your prayers and gifts. We are halfway through our 13<sup>th</sup> year and God remains faithful in supplying our needs! All of our funding comes from small local churches, individual contributions, charitable groups, and private corporate grants, all of which are a blessing as we trust in God's provision! As always, we are praying that God continues to guide and direct this project and we trust His hand in all things. Please be in prayer with us that we continue to walk in His will and in

obedience to His plan. We continue to encourage our residents to join us in church, Bible studies, and fellowship groups but they are not required to attend. We pray that He will prepare the hearts of our residents to be open to the Word of God.

Kathy, Eugene, and Tina continue to do an incredible job handling most of the everyday needs of the residents. It is such a blessing to have brothers and sisters in Christ that work very well together to split the workload so no one of us is overwhelmed. Thank you for your continued prayers and support!
